

Get out and explore the Perth Hills and enjoy a range of incredible walk and cycle trails.

Local trails



Bibbulmun Track

The Bibbulmun Track is Western Australia's only true long-distance walk trail, stretching from Kalamunda in the north to Albany in the south. The track bisects the Perth Hills National Parks Centre, a good stop for an ice-cream or cappuccino.



Munda Biddi Trail

The Munda Biddi Trail is Western Australia's first long distance off-road cycling trail. When it is finished, the Munda Biddi Trail will guide riders through vast areas of unspoiled forests and bushland from Mundaring to Albany. The first section of the Munda Biddi Trail is complete and travels 332 kilometres from Mundaring Sculpture Park to Collie.



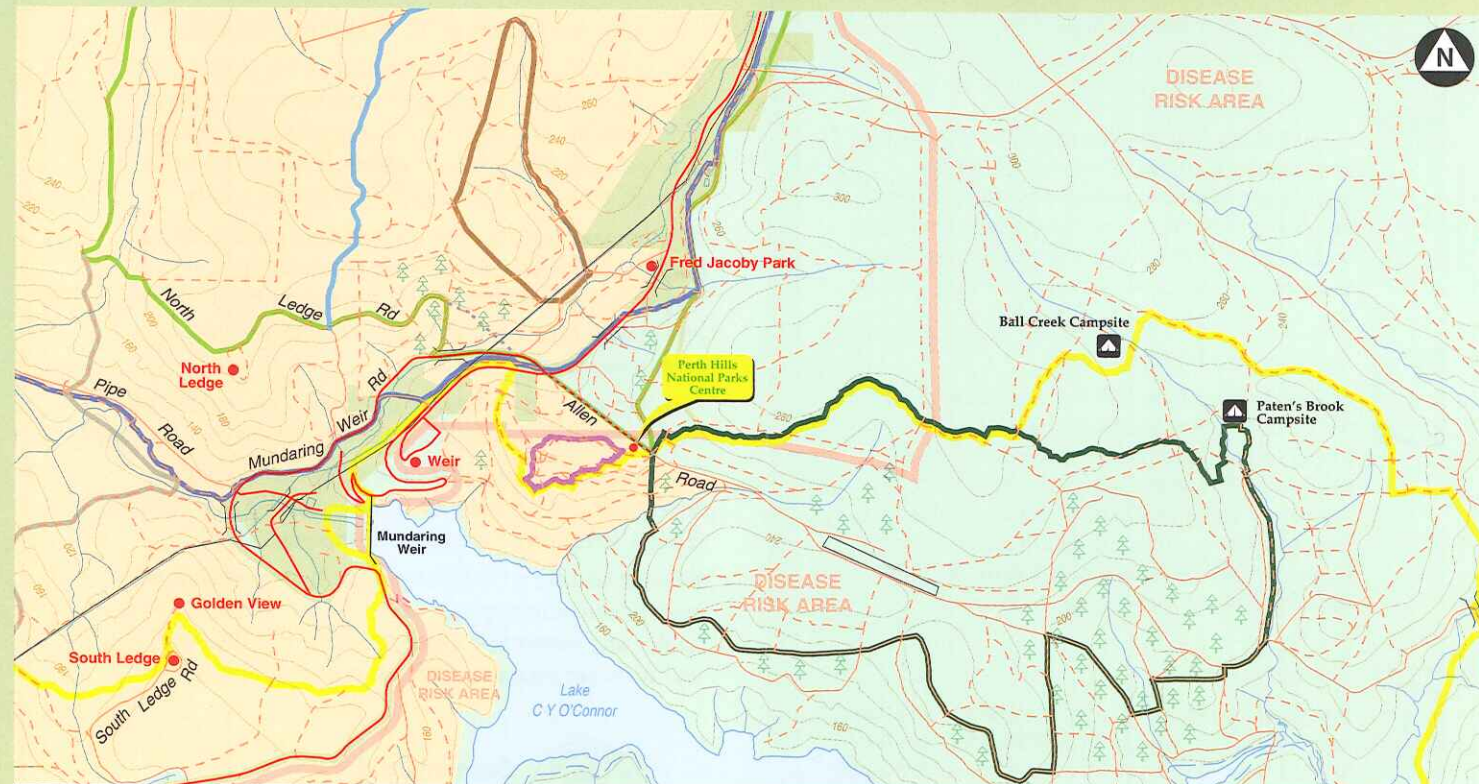
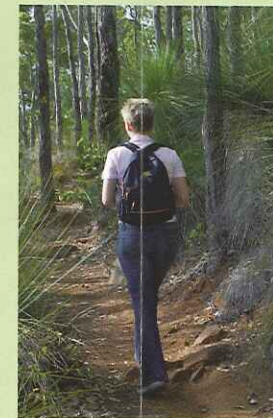
Weir View Walk

The Weir View Walk is a 1.5-kilometre loop trail that starts and ends at the Perth Hills National Parks Centre and journeys to a viewing platform overlooking the Mundaring Weir. This is a pleasant and scenic 20 to 30-minute walk.



Paten's Brook Track

Paten's Brook Track is an eight-kilometre loop that starts on the northern side of the Perth Hills National Parks Centre car park and goes via the Patens Brook campsite – a great place for a snack and toilet break. The southern return from the campsite includes lovely views of the Weir and Lake C Y O'Connor. The trail goes through dieback-infested forest so walkers must clean their shoes when they exit the area to prevent spread of the disease.

Mundaring Loop Trail – Trail closed

This 16.6-kilometre circular bike trail can be started at any point. To start at the Perth Hills National Parks Centre, look for the markers north of the car park. This is also a signed walk trail and can be joined at any point.



Portagabra Trail

This 3.8-kilometre circular walk track starts and finishes at Fred Jacoby Park. The track gets its name from the property owned by the Jacoby family, which was later given to the people of Western Australia as a recreation area.



Lower Helena Trail

Lower Helena Trail can be enjoyed by horseriders and walkers. It covers 40 kilometres, broken into stages, with five parking sites for vehicles. Beginning at the Grevillea Mycumbene picnic site on Mundaring Weir Road, it provides scenic views along Helena Valley through jarrah-marri forests.



Kattamorda Heritage Trail

Kattamorda Heritage Trail is a 27-kilometre walk track that starts at Mundaring and traverses forest, orchard and farmland along the top of the Darling Range to Carmel, where it descends via Bickley Valley to Bickley Reservoir. The section from Mundaring to the Mundaring Weir is seven kilometres and in many places follows the old rail spur line from Mundaring to the Weir.



Golden pipeline

The golden pipeline has two interpretive walktrails – the Weir Walk, which is 1.9 kilometres, and the 5.3-kilometre O'Connor Trail. For more information contact the National Trust of Australia on 9321 6088.
